National picture – context for first set of results following the pandemic

Attainment in all of reading, writing and maths has decreased compared to 2019

59% of pupils met the expected standard in all of reading, writing and maths, down from 65% in 2019.

In individual subjects, attainment increased slightly in reading and fell in all other subjects compared to 2019

74% of pupils met the expected standard in reading, up from 73% in 2019.

71% of pupils met the expected standard in maths, down from 79% in 2019.

69% of pupils met the expected standard in writing, down from 78% in 2019.

72% of pupils met the expected standard in grammar, punctuation and spelling, down from 78% in 2019.

79% of pupils met the expected standard in science, down from 83% in 2019

EYFS Data – submitted in June 2022

Note for interpreting the data: A 'good level of development' (GLD) can be defined as a child reaching the 'expected' level of development at the end of their reception year, at the end of EYFS. It is an outcome of a summative assessment based on learning outcomes in regard to the prime areas of learning.

A GLD is defined as reaching the expected level in the prime areas of learning (Communication and Language; Physical Development; Personal, Social and Emotional Development), along with specific aspects of mathematics and literacy.

- A higher percentage of girls than boys were at the expected level of development across all early learning goals (ELGs) and areas of learning.
- The physical development area of learning had the highest percentage of children at the expected level of development (85%), and the literacy area of learning had the lowest (68%).
- Of the regions, Outer London had the highest percentage of children with a good level of development (68%) whilst the North West had the lowest (62%).
