Dear Parents,

Please be aware that we are unable to allow children to leave site with people we do not know or have no permission to take a child. If you have not rung school to give permission for a friend, neighbour or a different parent we will take a moment to call parents to resolve this prior to letting the child go. If this happens please be aware the team are safeguarding your child and please be supportive and respectful of them. Thank you.

Also to be aware school bell goes at 8.40am and the doors and gates close at 8.45am. Children should all be in school by 8.40am everyday. If you are arriving late every day please consider how this feels for your child to walk into a classroom where everyone else has started working. I know some mornings can be tricky and we completely understand that, but we hope you will work with us to ensure children are in school on time and ready to learn!

It has also been brought to my attention that sometimes older siblings are arriving to collect children from school. Again if your child is in Year R, 1 or 2 they will not be permitted to leave site with an older child and an adult will need to come on site to collect them. If they are in Key Stage 2 we will need permission from the parent to allow an sibling to collect.
